Dear Riverley Families,

The Griffin Sports Festival will take place on **Thursday 6 and Friday 7 October 2022** and this will include competitions between all the schools in the Griffin Schools Trust. The festival will include an **Inter-School Residential** for twelve Year 6 and 7 pupils, from every one of our Griffin Schools. Your child has made a fantastic contribution to Sport, at Riverley, and for that reason they have been selected to attend this year's competition which will be held at **Pingles Leisure Centre & Stadium**, **Nuneaton**. Your child will be supervised by Riverley staff, at all times.

We will depart school on **Thursday 6 October 08:00** and plan to arrive back to Riverley at **16:00 on Friday 7 October.** We kindly ask that you provide your child with a packed lunch on the first day, which they will eat during the day. If your child receives free school meals, we will provide your child with a packed lunch. The Griffin Schools Trust will provide all other meals including dinner on the Thursday and breakfast and lunch on the Friday.

As the children will be staying overnight, they will need to bring their own **sleeping bags** and a list of additional items (see overleaf). **We will hold a meeting on Friday 23 September at 15:30 - in Venus Class - to give you additional information about all of the incredible activities that your child will be participating in.** This will also give you the opportunity to ask any questions, that you may have.

This truly is a wonderful opportunity for your child to meet other Griffins and participate in an array of sporting activities. I have no doubt that they will do Riverley proud by remaining resilient, ambitious and displaying great Sportsmanship, throughout the event! By attending the Griffin Sports Festival (Inter-school Cup), individuals agree to abide by the Codes of Conduct as outlined below. There are codes for players (team members), teachers and coaches (team officials) as well as spectators. Participating schools must ensure that all athletes, coaches, spectators and parents have read and acknowledged the relevant codes. Should spectators, teachers, team members break these codes of conduct, there may be consequences, including but not limited to the individuals being removed from the games.





## Team Officials' (Teachers/Coaches) Code of Behaviour

- Show respect to others involved in the game including referees, opposition players,
- coaches, managers, officials and spectators
- Adhere to the Laws of the Game
- Display and promote high standards of behaviour
- Always respect the match officials and referee's decisions
- Never enter the field of play without the referee or match official's permission
- Never engage in public criticism of the referees or match officials
- Never engage in or tolerate, offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour

### Team Members' Code of Behaviour

- Co-operate with teachers, coaches, volunteers, team mates and opponents. Without them there would be no game!
- Respect the referee, umpire and officials' decisions and the rules of the game.
- Treat all people fairly and with respect regardless of race, background, religious beliefs or gender.
- Control your temper both on and off the playing area. The use of bad language,
- deliberately fouling or provoking an opponent is not permitted
- Do not criticise others by words or gesture.
- Work to the best of your ability both individually and as a team.
- Be a good sport. Cheer all good play whether it is from your team or the other team.
- Respect the facility and equipment being used.
- Respect the school buildings and its contents.
- Do not disturb others after lights out.

### **Spectators' Code of Behaviour**

- Remain outside the field of play and behind the designated spectator areas (where provided)
- Never engage in or tolerate, offensive, insulting or abusive language or behaviour
- Respect the official's decision. If there is a disagreement, follow the appropriate procedure in order to question the decision and teach young people to do likewise.
- Applaud effort and good play as well as success
- Remember that children play for fun
- Let the coaches do their job and do not tell them what to do
- Encourage the players to respect the opposition and match officials
- Never criticise a player for making a mistake. Mistakes are part of learning

### **Breach of Codes**

#### **Team Members**

A breach of this code of behaviour, in the opinion of team officials, may result in the player being banned from the remainder of the Games and may also result in the player being sent home by the first available transport. Parents and the student's school will be notified. Any additional expense incurred will be the responsibility of the parents. Further disciplinary action may be considered depending on the seriousness of the breach.

# Team Officials & Spectators

A breach of this code of behaviour, in the opinion of Sports Director, may result in the individual being banned from the remainder of the Games and future events. Any additional expense incurred will be the responsibility of the individual concerned. Further action may be considered against the school and by the school depending on the seriousness of the breach.

#### Changes to the Programme or Rules

The Griffin Schools Trust has the right to make changes to the programme, rules or any other aspect of the Games as it deems fit and or necessary for clarity or safety. Any changes will be communicated to all participating teams at the same time for fairness.



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
